Australian Rogaining Championships

Alice Springs, Northern Territory 28-29 July 2007

The Yeperenye Yaw 28th Australian Rogaining Championships were held near Alice Springs, Northern Territory on 28-29 July 2007. The organizers were the Northern Territory Rogaining Association with assistance from rogainers from South Australia and Victoria. Nearly 300 participants represented ACT (20), NSW (47), NT (23), Queensland (12), SA (45), Tasmania (2), Victoria (93), WA (26); and there were 16 international participants from New Zealand. The rogaine was held in the rugged sandstone hills of the east MacDonnell Ranges near the centre of Australia. Sparse vegetation except the widespread spinifex, steep hillsides and cliffs, and dry watercourses characterized the varied course. Overall winners of the Championships Australian Mackay and Philip Whitten from NSW by a margin of 20 points over Julie Quinn and David Baldwin from ACT. The interstate trophy was won by Victoria.

The 10th North American Rogaining Championships took place at the Espresso Sports in Sainte-Adele. This was the eighth Laurentian Rogaine, and 200 participants came from eastern Canada and the United States.

Each participant received a special topographic map covering a forested area of 185 square kilometres with 50 controls. Reflectors attached to the white and red orienteering flags rendered their search easier.

A rainy Saturday morning was followed by a humid night which slowed many unprepared teams. On Sunday morning, warm weather returned with the sun for the enjoyment of participants and volunteers.

Joe Brautigam and Dave Lamb reached 38 controls and gained 1968 points out of a maximum of 2392. Scott Pleban and Jon Barker came in second overall with 1904 points. Lenora Delaney, Francis Lambert and Pascal Laroche came third with 1864 points.

The organizers would like to thank the towns of Sainte-Adele, Piedmont, Prevost, Saint-Hippolyte, Sainte-Annedes-Lacs and Sainte-Marguerite-du-Lac-Masson, P'tit train du Nord Linear park Corporation, landowners and numerous volunteers who gave their time, effort and warm reception to the participants.
